

## How to Join a 4-H Club for 2021...

If you don't know in which project area(s) you would like to participate, **4-H Project Central is the place to start:** <https://projectcentral.ohio4h.org/> this website is where you can **Search** new projects, **Learn** all about a project and you can **Rate** your project or call the Extension office to request a copy of the Family Guide (also available on our website). Once you review the Family Guide and determine which project area(s) you are interested in, review the complete listing of Licking County 4-H clubs within this brochure. Directly contact any advisor whose club seems to meet your needs. Meeting areas are approximate; so if you are willing to travel, you are welcome to join any club in the county. You can also join more than one club within Licking County.

The 4-H year runs January - December. **Annual enrollment deadline is April 1<sup>st</sup>.** You **MUST** choose a club and your project(s) prior to enrolling online. Work with your advisor to get enrolled on time.

Adults that are interested in becoming 4-H Volunteer Leaders should call our office and request an application (also available on our website). If you want to start a new club, first talk to Lisa at the Extension office. If you want to become a volunteer leader in an existing club, please talk to the head advisor of that club before completing and submitting the application. Volunteer applications for the current year are due by February 1.
