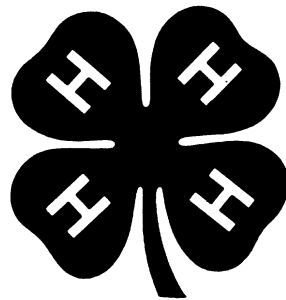

1. **Applicant Eligibility...**
 - a. The applicant must be a current Licking County 4-H member.
 - b. The applicant must have completed five or more consecutive years of 4-H work within Licking County.
 - c. The applicant must have been active in the 2020 4-H year.
 - d. The applicant must be at least a high school senior during the 2020-21 school year. Members who have completed their final year in 4-H during this 2020 project year **are** eligible.
 - e. Application must be typed (not handwritten). Applicants may feel free to re-create this document on a home computer providing that spacing and margins are consistent with this application provided by the 4-H Committee.
 - f. Application must be accompanied by completed Ohio 4-H Achievement Record.
 - g. Previous recipients are ineligible.
 - h. Application must be received by **4:30 p.m. on October 16th**.

2. **Selection is based upon...**
 - a. Involvement and participation in 4-H on local, county, district, state, and national levels during prior years within Licking County 4-H program as reported within Ohio 4-H Achievement Record.

3. **Awarding of the Scholarship...**
 - a. The official presentation of the Scholarship awards will be made during the 4-H Recognition Event to be held in November. The scholarship check will be awarded once the 4-H Committee has received a copy of the award winner's paid fee receipt.

_____	_____	<u>Citizenship Washington Focus</u> (ages 16+) Teens will learn about government, national events, national landmarks, citizenship and personal responsibility. Participants will stay at the National 4-H Center in Washington, D.C. (June 2021) (Cost to member will be approximately \$300.00.)
_____	_____	<u>Leadership Washington Focus</u> (Enrolled in 8 th Grade) Teens will learn about leadership, national events, national landmarks, integrity and personal responsibility. Participants will stay at the National 4-H Center in Washington, D.C. (July 2021) (Cost to member will be approximately \$237.50.)
_____	_____	<u>Ohio 4-H Conference</u> A one-day state-wide event. This event will offer a large variety of sessions from which teens can gain experience and information that can be used within the county 4-H programs as well as in their own local 4-H clubs. (March 2021) (Cost to member will be approximately \$20.00)
_____	_____	<u>Ohio Sea Camp</u> (ages 15-18, as of camp dates) Experiential learning for youth in environmental education, recreational water safety, conservation, aquatic science, developing positive self-esteem, decision-making, and an appreciation of the Great Lakes as an important water resource to Ohio. (July 2021) (Cost to member will be approximately \$200.)
_____	_____	<u>State Leadership Camp</u> (ages 15+) Teens will participate in a wide variety of programs on leadership skills, communication, and culture at 4-H Camp Ohio. (June 2021). (Cost to member will be approximately \$140.)
_____	_____	<u>State Shooting Sports Education Camp</u> (ages 14+) Teens will participate in a wide variety of training opportunities with hands-on instruction and experience. Canter's Cave. (July 2021). (Cost to member will be approximately \$162.50)

The 4-H member will be asked to pay a portion of the cost of their trip (as indicated above). In most cases, this amount represents 50% or less of their actual trip registration costs. Cancellation will be accepted no later than the deadline which is set for deposits to be submitted (typically mid-March). Members making cancellation after that time will likely be asked to reimburse the Licking County 4-H Committee the full amount of registration, as that full amount would have already been paid on their behalf.

Points to Remember When Working on your Photo Page
(Developed by Lisa McCutcheon, 4-H Educator, Licking County)

- You want to choose only a few photos. No fewer than five to eight should be used. There is no maximum number, but use common sense. Do not use a collage of photos—it just isn't professional.
- The photos that you choose should represent your entire tenure within 4-H project work. Choose a few from your younger years, and a few that are more recent. Just be sure that the photos relate DIRECTLY to the project area that you are applying to receive recognition.
- Remember to label the photos so the judge will understand what is being done in the photo. It is important they realize what the award was you were presented, or how old the member was you were mentoring, or that you are feeding a flock of animals that you have purchased and cared for yourself. Details help the judge to understand the breadth of your involvement.
- There are obviously a number of ways that are appropriate to arrange photos on a photo page. Just be sure they are displayed neatly, in color, with labels, and are easy to see (not too dark, too bright, or blurry), and that they relate to your 4-H project work.
- Do not include photos that depict you doing Girl Scout/Boy Scout/FFA/etc activities. Remember that we want your photo page to portray your accomplishments and growth through 4-H Youth Development programs.
